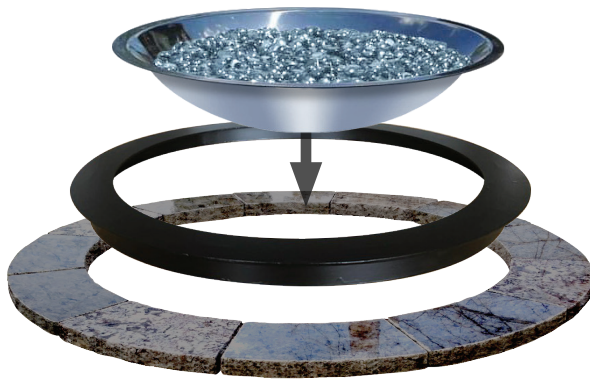


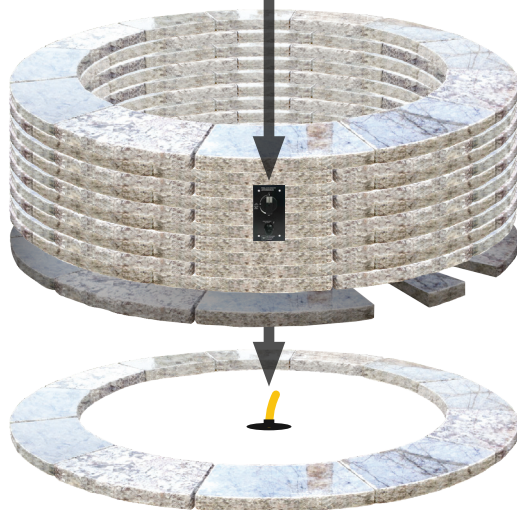


HOW TO BUILD YOUR NATURAL GAS / PROPANE FIRE PIT

This assembly guide supplements the Crystal Fire Plus burner instructions. A Crystal burner comes ready to use liquid propane. It can be easily converted to burn natural gas.

5 Ask a certified Gas Technician to connect the burner pan to the supply line. Add glass beads or lava rocks.

4 Ensure the assembled base is level and plumb. Inside this base, insert the steel burner bracket. Its flange can rest, dependent on personal preference, either above or under regular-sized top caps. If you purchased over-sized caps, secure them with adhesive under the flange for stability and safety.

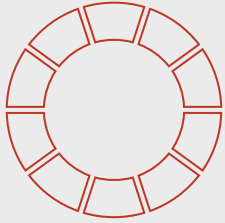
3 Determine the location of the control panel, preferably selecting the least visible side of the fire pit. Omit the granite pieces by using those numbered to create space for the control panel. Drill four holes into the exterior granite base in order to screw and, adhere, if necessary, the cover plate. Attach the sparker and control valve to the plate. Ask a certified Gas Technician to connect the flex hose to the valve as per the gas burner instructions.

2 Dry-stack or adhere the remaining granite pieces by staggering the joints. For the second row, replace two full granite pieces with the half-sized ones to create ventilation gaps on opposite sides of the fire pit. Cut and secure wire mesh to the inside wall of these gaps so rodents don't make your fire pit home. Check for vertical plumb. If leveling is needed, apply a teaspoon of sand with exterior grade silicone, PL 620 Granite/Marble, or PL Premium Constructive Adhesive between rows.

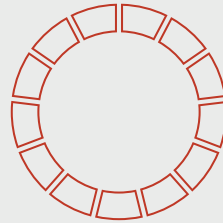
1 Clean granite pieces with water and a nylon brush, if necessary. Lay the first row of pieces around a gas feed and away from buildings, tree branches, and/or a wooden gazebo or pergola. Ensure to install this row on a level surface.

You've just assembled your RealStone Granite Fire Pit, a focal point of your outdoor living space. Relax and enjoy with family and friends while creating memorable moments by the fire.

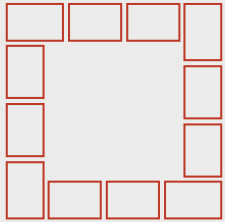
NOTE: In order to insert a standard 20lb propane tank into the base of a RealStone Fire Pit, please purchase chatting height, which comes with 16 rows of granite (20" high).



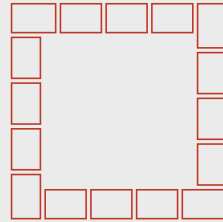
ROUND 35

Warning

For your safety. For outdoor use only.

1. This fire pit / fire table is for outdoor use only, and shall NOT be used in a building, garage, or any enclosed area.
2. Do NOT use this outdoor fire pit for indoor heating. TOXIC carbon monoxide fumes can accumulate and cause asphyxiation.
3. This outdoor fire pit is NOT to be operated by children.
4. Always use in accordance with all applicable local, state, provincial and national codes. Contact your local fire department for details on outdoor burning.
5. When using this outdoor fire pit, exercise the same precautions you would with any open fire.
6. The use of alcohol, prescription or non-prescription drugs may impair the operator's ability to properly assemble or safely operate this outdoor fire pit.
7. Do NOT store or use gasoline or other flammable vapors or liquids in the vicinity of this or any other appliance.
8. Do NOT store or use an LP gas cylinder within 10 feet (3.05 m) of this outdoor fire pit while it is in operation.
9. Do NOT use this outdoor fire pit near automobiles, trucks, vans or recreational vehicles.
10. Do NOT use this outdoor fire pit under any overhead or near any unprotected combustible constructions. Avoid using near or under overhanging trees and shrubs.
11. Always use this outdoor fire pit on a hard, level non-combustible surface such a concrete, rock or stone. An asphalt or blacktop surface may not be acceptable for this purpose.
12. Do NOT use in extreme windy conditions.
13. Do NOT leave a lit outdoor fire pit unattended, especially around children and pets.
14. Use heat-resistant gloves or hot pads when contacting grills.
15. Do NOT place a hot spark screen guard or hot fire pit tools onto combustible surfaces such as grass, wooden deck or furniture.
